- Civil and Criminal Courts Advocacy: guidance through court process, safety planning, and referral to The Center's support services
- Community Education & Prevention: education for schoolchildren and adults, professional trainings, and state mandated 40 hr. counselor certification training.
- Women of Change Program: reintegration support for pre/post-release women offenders with a history of domestic and sexual trauma
- Multidisciplinary Investigative Team: community collaborative case management team that investigates child disclosures of sexual or severe physical abuse

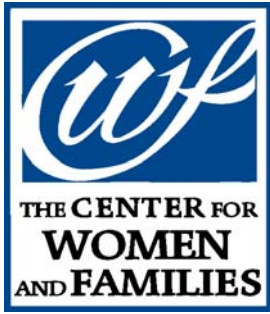

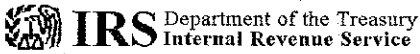
